As Billed Consumption Start and End Date descriptions: Contact's interpretation is that the consumption start and end dates for an 'As Billed' file should reflect exactly what has been invoiced to the consumer during the report month. Therefore the consumption start date will not in all cases match the three rules supplied in the document. In some cases there may be an unbilled period between the previous report periods consumption end date and the current report periods consumption start date will not in all cases match the three rules supplied in the document. In some cases there may be an unbilled period between the previous consumer's end (final) date and the current consumer's start (entry) date. e.g. Previous customer closes account 07/01/2011 (Final bill from 20/12/2010 to 07/01/2011) New customer moves in 15/01/2011 and is not billed until 15/02/2011. GIEP1 produced for 201101 period (at beginning of February 2011) Start Date - 20/12/2010 End Date - 07/01/2011 GIEP1 produced for 201102 period (at beginning of March 2011) Start Date - 15/02/2011 Period 08/01/2011 - 14/01/2011 is never billed and never reported. Reversal Status: There may be some situations where a new bill with an adjustment for a previous retail bill is processed, the number of days should be positive 'to 'f a new bill, with an adjustment for the previous retail bill, is processed, the number of days should be positive to 'f a new bill, with an adjustment for the nevious retail bill, is processed, the number of days should be positive 'to 'f a new bill, with an adjustment (i.e. the number of days should match the days on the bill to the customer)". Unbilled Status: It would be beneficial for the following fields to also be provided for a 'UB' line in order to enable easier identification of the period the 'UB' relates to and the CP details (e.g. Gas Gate) at the time the report was generated – Detail Record, Gas Gate, Distributor ID and Report Month. <
