Re: Options for Information Disclosure in the Wholesale Gas Sector: Consultation Paper

## 1 Outages

1.1 Greymouth Gas agrees in principle to provide planned and unplanned upstream outage information on a voluntary basis, after requirements are set. We understand that this aligns with major upstream participants.

## 2 Next Steps

- 2.1 GIC has yet to technically define any problem, or any of the key terms such as information and markets. All markets are interrelated on either a short or long run basis, and it is clear that there are additional information disclosure problems across the supply chain.
- 2.2 We recommend GIC consults on a second options paper or similar following the first round of submissions.
- 2.3 The biggest issue is security of supply and demand and related information disclosure issues.

## 3 Problems

- 3.1 Greymouth Gas considers that the top 4 problems (aside from upstream / downstream outages which GIC can define a problem for) are:
  - > **Upstream:** Storage providers do not supply prevailing quantities of stored gas information to the market.
  - ➤ Midstream: The TSO does not supply cost and asset values on a per pipeline basis with sufficient granularity to check how individual transmission pricing netbacks relate to the Commerce Commission's pricing principles, nor will the TSO supply near real-time OBA estimated running mismatch data to the market under the GTAC.
  - **Downstream:** The market does not know (with any accuracy) the quantity of demand idling and demand destruction, or the quantity and carbon footprint of demand that has

switched to higher-polluting substitute fuels, or the level of competition amongst suppliers for demand in categories AG4 and above.

- ➤ emsTP: emsTP does not publish the live trading board, the full list of market participants, or an energy-only gas price, and it also impedes transparent price discovery.
- 3.2 Each of the identified 4 problems must be considered contrary to the Gas Act and GPS objectives.<sup>1</sup>
