In fact the GIC has already consulted with the Industry on some consumer issues such as disconnection charges.
the preferred model in any area, or support the other alternatives?	Consumer issues are therefore likely to lead the GIC into contractual arrangements between in the main, Network and GMS operators on one side and Retailers on the other side.
	Wanganui Gas Ltd (WGL) appreciates that the GIC would prefer to stay out of contractual matters but we cannot see how this is possible with regards to certain Consumer issues and we do not see where the current proposals intend to deal with theses types of issues.

Q 10: Do you agree with our assessment of the options for early resolution and/or settlement	Yes and No. WGL believes that the economic efficiency may be enhanced with a two stage early resolution and settlement process whereby the parties involved should they agree be given the first opportunity to resolve any breaches them selves. The matter could then be submitted to the independent investigator if the parties cannot agree on an outcome.
Q 11: Do you agree with our assessment of the options for enforcement?	Yes, an independent third party should be the prosecutor rather than an effected party.
Q 12: Do you consider that these are appropriate functions for a Rulings Panel?	In general yes

For appointments only so long as the GIC consults with the Gas Industry to ensure that there are no potential conflicts of interest.  Yes with regards to remove under specified grounds.

Like question 13 given the lack of information on potential cases it is difficult to comment on this issue, however WGL believe that an initial three year term makes sense and this can be reviewed over the initial 3 year period.

Yes however the Gas Industry is relatively small and it is possible that a pool of "Industry Experts" with no conflict of interest may be very small.

In general yes however it is difficult to comment without any experience on where and on what type of issues this discretionary power would be applied.
