QUESTION	COMMENT
Q1: Do you agree with the proposal not to alter the structure of the levy for the 2007/08 financial year?	Yes
Q2: Do participants consider that it is appropriate to change the reference quantities for calculating the wholesale levy from the quarter before the last quarter to the quantity used during the previous month?	Yes it appears to us to make sense to have the levy collection as closely aligned to the previous month as possible. However as we simply pay the wholesale levy to our Gas Wholesaler we cannot comment on how difficult this type of alignment will be.
Q3: Do participants consider that it is useful to provide a comparison of previous years' costs with the budget figures?	Yes
Q4: Do you agree with the allocation of costs between the wholesale and retail work programmes?	Yes
Q5: Do you agree that unallocated costs should be split evenly between retail and wholesale?	No WGL believes that the unallocated costs should be proportionally split between the two work streams based on the work program for each particular year.

Q6: Do you agree that it is appropriate to increase the levy for 2007/08 to the levels set out above given the requirements of the proposed work programme and Gas Industry Co's statutory obligations?	
	Customers may be more willing to accept such increases if they see the levy varying both up and down depending on the work program which we accept is difficult to demonstrate given that the Gas Industry Company is only in its third year of operation.
	It should also be remembered that ultimately the customer pays for both the Wholesale and Retail levies. The almost 30% increase in the Retail Levy and an 8% increase in the Wholesale Levy is simply another increase that the customer has to pay for his or her gas on top of the increases in compliance, transportation and wholesale gas costs being incurred by retail companies.
